

Ornament Gift Box

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Supplies:

Cardstock of Choice and/or Designer Paper

Scor-Pal®,

Transparency

Die Cut (in this case Spellbinder's Nestabilities)

Scor-Tape™

Exacto knife

Ribbon

Large Brads

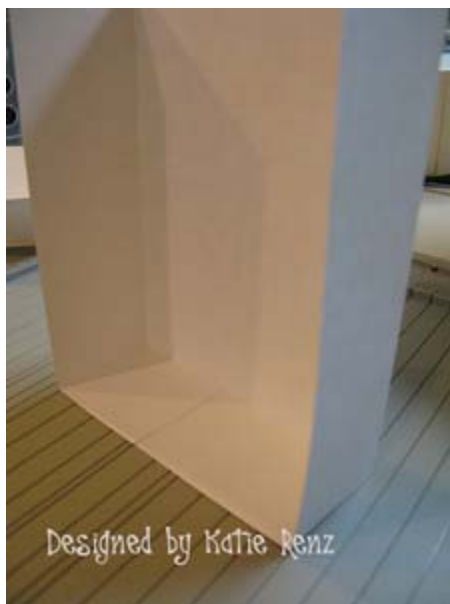
Big Bite™



Step 1:

Cut base cardstock 8 1/2 x 9. Along the 9" side score at 2" and 7". Along the 8 1/2" side score at 2".

*** You will need 2 pieces cut and scored - one being the back of the box and the other being the front***



Step 2: Cut along the bottom to create your bottom folds (on both pieces)

Step 3: Glue the bottom flaps down. This is the back half of the box. I didn't decorate this section at all as nothing will be showing except the back and I just left that white.

Step 4: Cut a piece of designer paper that measures 6 1/4" x 4 3/4". This will leave you a slight border around the paper.

Place this piece of paper on your die cut machine and then center your die cut where you want your window.



Step 5: Now place your designer paper with the cut out window over the front of the front half of the box. Center the next size smaller die in the cut window.

Fold the side flaps under so the whole thing will fit through the machine. It won't matter because you will have more designer paper on the sides



Step 6: Turn the front 1/2 of the box to the inside and attach a piece of transparency to the inside of the box.





Step 7: Glue the bottom flaps together and then slide the back half into the front half and glue bottom and sides together.
*** this example does not have the window cut out***



Step 8: Cut a piece of cardstock $7 \frac{1}{8}'' \times 4 \frac{1}{8}''$ for the lid. Score 1" on all 4 sides and cut on score marks on 2 opposite sides.



Step 9: Cut designer paper to fit the top ($4 \frac{7}{8}'' \times 1 \frac{7}{8}''$), front ($4 \frac{7}{8}'' \times \frac{7}{8}''$), and the sides ($1 \frac{7}{8}'' \times \frac{7}{8}''$)
Glue flaps on inside.



Step 10: Flip top over and cut a slit in the center of the lid. This is where the ribbon will be inserted.



Step 11: Fold ribbon in 1/2 and insert the folded section through the slit and adjust to desired loop length.

Use the tails that are hanging on the inside to loosely tie the hanger from the ornament. It will stay in place perfectly because the ornament weighs nothing.

Here is another picture of the box with top and ornament.



Handle for box:

Strip of cardstock 1" x 12"
Designer Paper 3/4" x 12"

Round the ends with a corner rounder.



Punch a hole in each handle. Mark the placement on the sides of the box. Make sure that placement is done with the lid on. Mark with some sort of marker.

You can use a paper piercer, but be careful. Use a Cropadile Big Bite because all the hand held ones do not go deep enough. Attach with large brads.
